**Official Report on the July 23, 2006 Attack on Red Cross
Ambulances 777 and 782**

PUBLICATION No. 9-10

December, 2006

Introduction

Upon a review of the reporting on the events transpiring on July 23, 2006 near Qana, Lebanon, along with the criticisms of the reporting and the follow-up work by Human Rights Watch,¹ we have conducted our own follow-on investigation.

Based on our investigation, which included interviews with a significant number of individuals having direct knowledge of information related to events occurring on or about July 23, 2006,² along with a review of a significant portion of official photographs of the aftermath of such events³ and written records based at least partly on eyewitness testimony of such events,⁴ we have come to the conclusion that the Israeli munitions striking ambulances 777 and 782 were not Hellfire⁵ missiles or Spike missiles.⁶

Our detailed analysis as to the Spike missile and our conclusions as to the Israeli munitions which did destroy ambulances 777 and 782 are set forth in detail below.

Missiles

The Hellfire Missile

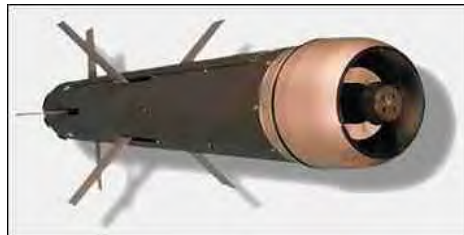
As noted above, Human Rights Watch and others have now rejected the conclusion that ambulances 777 and 1782 were hit by Hellfire missiles. Based on our analysis, Human Rights Watch is correct that a Hellfire missile would blow a Volkswagen T3 Transporter Ambulance completely apart.⁷ We note that the Hellfire missile is the type of missile used to assassinate Sheikh Ahmed Ismail Yassin in 2004⁸ (see image below):



Based on their own analysis, Human Rights Watch determined that the weapon used was a Spike missile or similar munition.⁹

The Spike Missile

The Spike missile has been billed as “the world’s smallest guided missile.” It was designed to be small and inexpensive, and to minimize collateral damage. This is an image of a Spike missile:

Although designed to minimize collateral damage outside of a target vehicle, the Spike missile is specifically designed to destroy its target and kill the occupants. Pictured below is a view of the results of a Spike attack on a pickup truck:



Evan a cursory review of the photos of ambulances 777 and 782 reveals that neither ambulance experienced this level of destructive power.

After careful analysis, we have determined that the Spike, a high-explosive anti-armor missile,¹⁰ would have a very similar effect to a Hellfire missile on a Volkswagen ambulance.¹¹ Given that the mass and flight velocity of the Spike missile are similar to those of the Hellfire missile, the “kinetic energy” of a strike by an unarmed Spike would be very similar to that of an unarmed Hellfire.¹² There was, however, no evidence of fire or missile debris found in either ambulance, which is at least somewhat inconsistent with a missile attack.¹³ Accordingly, we conclude that neither a Hellfire missile nor a Spike missile was used against ambulances 777 and 782.¹⁴

Given that neither the Hellfire missile nor the Spike missile is a likely candidate for the Israeli munition which destroyed ambulances 777 and 782, a more reasonable explanation must be available. Our conclusions are outlined in detail below.

What Attacked the Qana Ambulances?

Meteorites

Meteorites are well-known for causing damage to vehicles, often at inopportune times. Shown below are images of vehicles having sustained damage from meteorites.



By way of comparison, here are pictures of the damage to the ambulances:



Note the tight punctures and shattered glass. All but the most unabashed apologists would agree that the similarity in the damage patterns is uncanny.¹⁵ And meteorite impacts occur with alarming regularity.¹⁶ There are over 31,000 well-documented meteorite finds.¹⁷ An estimated 500 meteorites ranging in size from marbles to basketballs or larger reach the surface of the Earth each year.¹⁸ Only 1% of these meteorites are ever recovered.¹⁹ Given that 99% of meteorites are never recovered, it is perfectly understandable why the two meteorites that hit the Qana ambulances were also not recovered.²⁰ Given the heavy weight of the available evidence, we conclude, therefore, that meteorite impacts²¹ are likely the cause of the damage to ambulances 777 and 782.

In a vacuum (such as outer space,)²² it might appear that destruction by meteorites would absolve the Israeli government from responsibility. This is not correct at all. The Israeli media apparatus is very skilled at deflecting blame.²³ Even if what happened to the ambulances was a purely natural

phenomenon, we cannot ignore the fact that those ambulances were in that place at that time as a result of reckless and illegal actions of the Israeli government.²⁴ The responsibility and fault for this damage lies, therefore, squarely on the shoulders of the Israelis.²⁵

Having said that, it is very likely that the meteorites that struck the two ambulances did not hit the ambulances by accident.²⁶ A direct hit on an ambulance by one meteorite is unlikely enough.²⁷ A direct hit on two ambulances by pure chance strains credulity.²⁸ It is, therefore, almost certain that the meteorites which struck the two ambulances were guided to the ambulances intentionally.²⁹ Israelites have long been known to use stones against their enemies.³⁰ It is well-known that the Israeli Defense Forces have developed technology capable of steering meteorites using the TRACTOR beam similar to those well-known in space programs.³¹ It is, therefore, very likely that the IDF used the TRACTOR beam to steer meteorites into ambulances 777 and 782.³² The IDF has never unequivocally disclaimed the use of the TRACTOR beam to steer meteorites to destroy ambulances in Lebanon, despite ample opportunities to do so.³³

Hail

There are, of course, other likely possibilities. Hail, for example, is also very likely to have been the cause of the damage to ambulances 777 and 782. Hail causes millions of dollars in property damage every year.³⁴ Shown below are images of the effects of hail on vehicles.



The hail that hit the ambulances, could, of course, have been random acts of nature, but this is unlikely.³⁵ It is well known that the IDF has a wide variety of weather manipulation technologies

in its military arsenal.³⁶ Jewish people have, in fact, long known the secrets of controlling the weather, as documented in the Old Testament³⁷ and in German sources dating back as far as the 12th century. They have been using hailstones as weapons for millenia.³⁸ It is highly likely that the IDF used its weather control technology to create unnaturally-large hailstones and then used its TRACTOR beam to steer hailstones into the ambulances at Qana.³⁹ This would be particular useful to the IDF in that the projectile leaves no residue other than water, which then evaporates, thereby giving the IDF a degree of plausible deniability.⁴⁰ This is consistent with the lack of shrapnel or debris within the passenger compartments.⁴¹ The lack of debris serves, therefore, as proof that the ambulances were hit by hailstones. Further bolstering this set of facts, the Israeli government has never unequivocally denied using the TRACTOR beam to steer hailstones at Lebanese civilians.

Lightning

Like meteorites, lightning is very well known for causing damage to property, including vehicles.⁴² Lightning strikes the Earth approximately 100 times every second.⁴³ It is a very common occurrence. The IDF is well-known to have the capability to generate lightning bolts at will using its above-described weather-control technology. As with hail, the ability to control lightning goes way back.⁴⁴ This is very similar to the technology used by the Israeli government to render Palestinian Arabs impotent and to cause their genitals to shrink, and even disappear.⁴⁵ Given this technology, it is very

likely that the Israelis used their weather control technology to direct lightning bolts at ambulances 777 and 782, thereby incapacitating them. As with hail, this is fully consistent with the lack of debris or shrapnel in the passenger compartments of both ambulances.

Magic Missiles

Much has been made of the fact that ambulances 777 and 782 did not appear to have sustained the level of damage normally associated with military warheads. This is perfectly consistent with prior experience. Jewish people are well-known to be skilled in the occult arts of sorcery, and it is very likely that one or more Israeli government sorcerers launched magic missiles at the ambulances from an undisclosed location nearby.⁴⁶ Pictured below are sorcerers having somewhat Jewish looks about them.



According to available reference manuals, a standard magic missile does only 1-6 hit points of damage.⁴⁷ By way of comparison, a normal civilian has 1-4 hit points.⁴⁸ Magic missiles are well-known to leave almost no residue after impact.⁴⁹ The IDF has never disclaimed the use of sorcery in its military campaigns.

Golems

Jews have possessed the technology to produce golems for at least several hundred years.⁵⁰ Further, the Israelis are known to have possession of plenty of raw materials for the manufacture of golems.



It has traditionally been believed that golems are slow-moving and would not be capable of catching up to a moving vehicle.⁵¹ Such ideas neglect to consider the craftiness of Jewish scientists. The IDF is well-known to be in possession of a number of high-technology golems, including the still-experimental FASTGOLEM, which can move (and kill) at a very high rate of speed.



Many of these golems incorporate cloaking technology to become invisible.⁵² Witnesses in the Qana area testified of hearing reports large numbers of “large humanoid figures” moving through the area just around the time of the IDF invasion. It is very likely that one of these IDF golems, or possibly a team of golems, jumped on the top of ambulances and punched holes through the tops of the

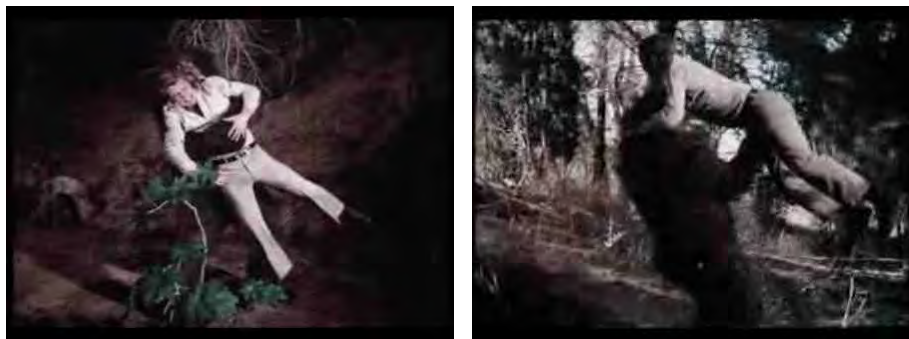
ambulances to get at the occupants. This would explain both the broad, shallow depressions in the ambulance rooftops as well as the absence of debris or shrapnel within the passenger compartments.

Sasquatches

Sasquatch attack cannot be ruled out as a possibility. Shown below is a photograph of an indigenous sasquatch in the United States.



It is well-known that the United States government secretly entered into a peace treaty with its indigenous sasquatch tribes sometime in the 1980s after the multiple climactic battles between the sasquatch leader "Bigfoot"⁵³ and the famous astronaut Col. Steve Austin—who was himself part golem, working under the command of Jewish scientist Oscar Goldman.⁵⁴ Pictured below are photographs of the climactic battles.



Pictured on the following page is photographic evidence of the successful negotiations between the sasquatches and U.S. Government representative Col. Steve Austin.

A number of witnesses report having heard testimony regarding possible sasquatches and large footprints in the Qana area in late-July.⁵⁵ Sasquatches are not known to be indigenous to Lebanon.⁵⁶ It is very likely that the IDF hired an army of sasquatches as mercenaries to supplement the capabilities of its own golem army.⁵⁷ It is, therefore, very likely that a sasquatch, or a team of sasquatches,⁵⁸ attacked the ambulance convoy in the same manner as that described above for golems.⁵⁹ Sasquatches are well-known to have voracious appetites.⁶⁰ One of the hungry sasquatches likely punched through the roof of the ambulance carrying Ahmed Fawaz and took his lower leg for a snack.⁶¹ In fact, Red Cross personnel noticed a number of fibrous strands in the passenger compartment of both vehicles that could not be ruled out as possible sasquatch fibers. Pictured above for reference is an image of a sasquatch standing on top of ambulance 782 (photo courtesy

Adnan Hajj). According to our calculations, the roof of an ambulance would not support a sasquatch.⁶² Note how the roof is caved in around the sasquatch.⁶³

Conclusion

Based on the above in-depth analysis, we have concluded that one or more of the above factors contributed to the destruction of ambulances 777 and 782 near Qana, Lebanon on July 23, 2006. Given the incontrovertible proof that the Israeli government was responsible for these attacks and the resulting wanton destruction, we call on the Israeli government to cease all operations in the Middle East immediately. It is our hope that this report will serve as a clarion call for the need for “peace in our time.”
